

Part-Time Position in Sociology

St. Thomas University invites internal applications for an instructor to teach the following course in Fredericton:

Semester 2: (January to April 2025)

SOCI 3243A Sociology of Men and Masculinities, MONDAYS 4:00 PM – 6:50 PM

In this course, students examine the social production of masculinities in North America and the impacts of these gender expressions on the lives of boys and men, and people of all genders. Students are introduced to theoretical perspectives used to understand the lives of men and boys, while examining topics such as fathering, the social construction of men's bodies, the ways the media (re)produces notions of masculinity, and sports masculinities.

St. Thomas University is an undergraduate, liberal arts institution with a full-time enrolment of 1,600. Its students graduate with Bachelor of Arts, Applied Arts, Education, and Social Work degrees. The faculty members are distinguished teachers, researchers and scholars, and the university holds two Canada Research Chairs.
